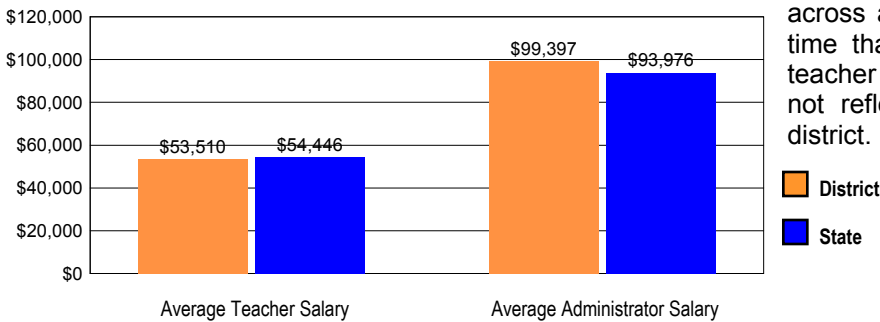

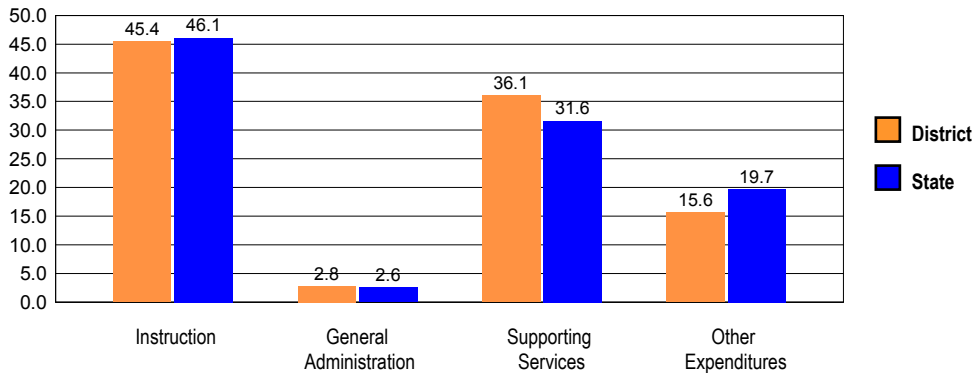
SCHOOL DISTRICT FINANCES

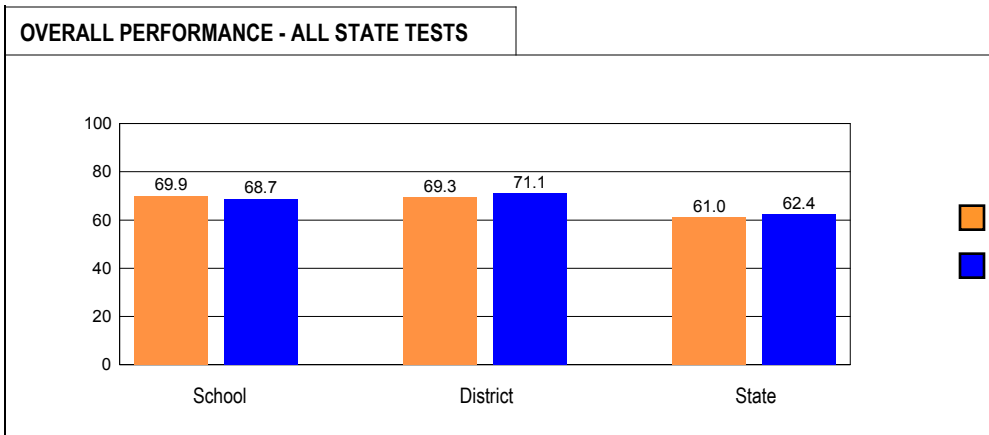

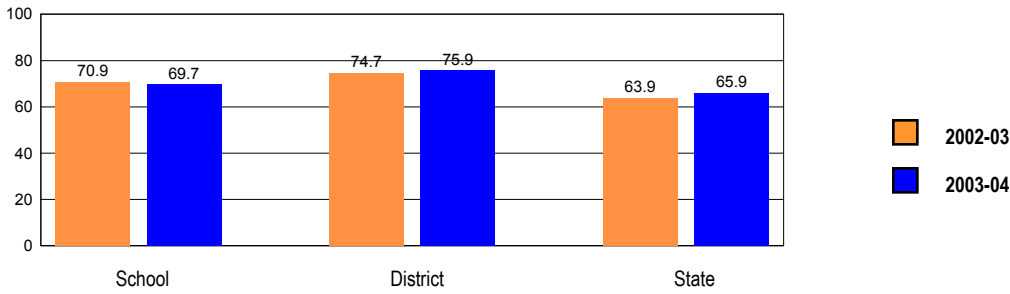

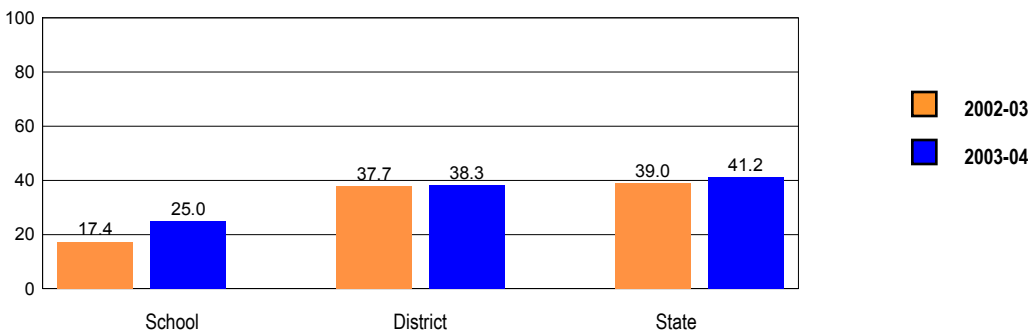

OVERALL ILLINOIS STANDARDS ACHIEVEMENT TEST (ISAT) PERFORMANCE



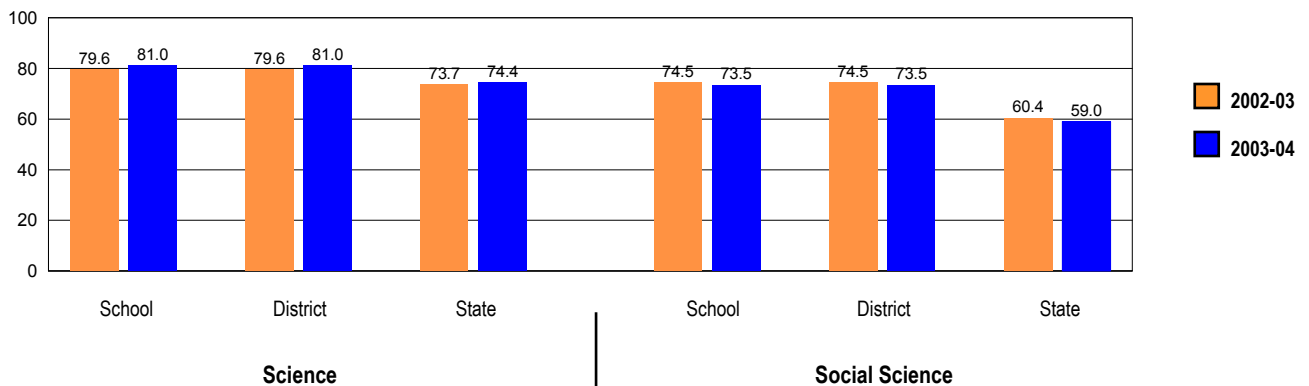
OVERALL ILLINOIS MEASURE OF ANNUAL GROWTH IN ENGLISH (IMAGE) PERFORMANCE

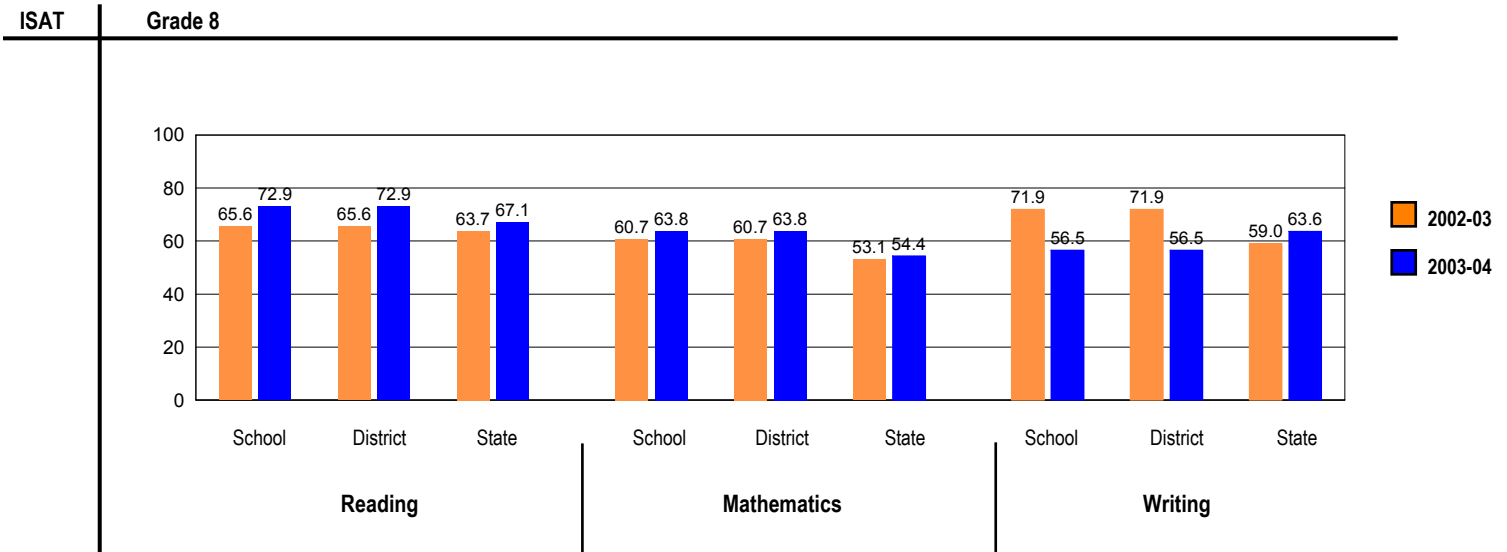

PERFORMANCE ON STATE ASSESSMENTS

Federal law requires that student achievement results for schools providing Title I services be reported to the general public.

The Illinois Standards Achievement Test (ISAT) is administered to students in grades 3, 4, 5, 7, and 8. The Prairie State Achievement Examination (PSAE) is administered to students in grade 11. The Illinois Measure of Annual Growth in English (IMAGE) is administered to students in state-approved transitional bilingual programs. The Illinois Alternate Assessment (IAA) is administered to students with disabilities whose Individualized Education Programs (IEPs) indicate that participation in the ISAT or PSAE would not be appropriate.

Students with disabilities have an IEP (No Child Left Behind Act). An IEP is a written plan for a child with a disability who is eligible to receive special education services under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act.

Schools with grade 2 as the highest grade in the school use a state-adopted test in reading and mathematics to meet this requirement.

In order to protect students' identities, test data for groups of fewer than ten students are not reported.

ILLINOIS STANDARDS ACHIEVEMENT TEST (ISAT)

The following tables show the percentages of student scores in each of four performance levels. These levels were established with the help of Illinois educators who teach the grade levels and learning areas tested. Due to rounding, the sum of the percentages in the four performance levels may not always equal 100.

Level 1 -- Academic Warning - Student work demonstrates limited knowledge and skills in the subject. Because of major gaps in learning, students apply knowledge and skills ineffectively.

Level 2 -- Below Standards - Student work demonstrates basic knowledge and skills in the subject. However, because of gaps in learning, students apply knowledge and skills in limited ways.

Level 3 -- Meets Standards - Student work demonstrates proficient knowledge and skills in the subject. Students effectively apply knowledge and skills to solve problems.

Level 4 -- Exceeds Standards - Student work demonstrates advanced knowledge and skills in the subject. Students creatively apply knowledge and skills to solve problems and evaluate the results.

Three Conditions Are Required For Making Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP)

1. At least 95.0% tested for Reading and Mathematics for the All Group and Subgroups. If the current year's participation rates are less than 95%, the participation rate for AYP will be considered sufficient if the average of the current year and the preceding year is at least 95%, or if the average of the current year and the two preceding years is at least 95%. Only actual participation rates are printed. If the participation rate printed is less than 95% but 'Met AYP' is 'Yes', it means the 95% condition was met by averaging.

2. At least 40.0% Meeting/Exceeding Standards for Reading and Mathematics for the All Group, and at least 37.0% for all Subgroups to compensate for error in measurement for smaller subgroup sizes, or meet Safe Harbor requirements***

3. At least 89.0% Attendance Rate for Non-High Schools or at least 66.0% Graduation Rate for High Schools

*** Subgroups with fewer than 40 students are not reported. Safe harbor only applies to subgroups. Safe harbor allows schools an alternate method to meet subgroup minimum targets on achievement.

AREAS OF SUCCESS:

1. Eighty-one percent of all WMS 7th grade students met or exceeded state standards on the science subtest of the ISAT which was superior to the state average.
2. Over seventy-three percent of WMS 7th grade students met or exceeded the state standards on the social science subtest of the ISAT which was superior to the state average.
3. Seventy-three percent of WMS 8th grade students met or exceeded the state standards on the reading subtest of the ISAT which was superior to the state average.
4. Fifty-nine percent of WMS 8th grade students met or exceeded the state standards on the vocabulary portion of the reading subtest of the ISAT which was above the state average of fifty-four percent.
5. Thirty-six percent of WMS 8th grade students met or exceeded the state standards on the extended response passage 1 of the reading subtest of the ISAT which was above the state average of twenty percent.
6. Thirty-three percent of WMS 8th grade students met or exceeded the state standards on the extended response passage 2 of the reading subtest of the ISAT which was above the state average of twenty-three percent.
7. Over sixty-three percent of WMS 8th grade students met or exceeded the state standards on the math subtest of the ISAT which was superior to the state average.
8. Seventy-One percent of the all WMS students met or exceeded the state standards on the algebraic relationships/representations compared to a state average of sixty- seven percent.
9. Sixty-four percent of the all WMS students met or exceeded the state standards on the algebraic relationships/representations compared to a state average of fifty-nine percent.

AREAS FOR THE PLANNED IMPROVEMENT:

1. To develop instructional strategies through the school improvement process to increase the percentage of all students meeting and exceeding the state standards for science and social studies.
2. To develop instructional strategies through the school improvement process to increase the percentage of all students meeting and exceeding the state standards for math, writing, and reading.
3. To improve our attendance rate from ninety-four percent during the 2003-2004 school year to ninety-five percent for the 2004-2005 school year.
